**Re: SECOND NOTIFICATION: Rehabilitation of Lake Worth Drainage District's L-5 Canal Right-of-Way from the LWDD E-3 Canal to Military Trail
LWDD Project No. 15-9795E.01**

Dear Ms. Lazo:

As indicated in the initial notification letter both mailed and hand-delivered on March 16, 2016, the Lake Worth Drainage District (District) is scheduled to begin necessary rehabilitation work on the L-5 Canal adjacent to your property. This work is necessary to facilitate effective flood control for public safety and provide unobstructed access for emergency flood control response and routine canal maintenance. Rehabilitation efforts may include removal of vegetative encroachments, removal of structural and non-structural encroachments, dredging of the canal channel, and reshaping or reconstruction of the canal bank(s). Encroachments located on the District's canal rights-of-way can create obstructions to water flow during a heavy rainfall event or hinder the District's ability to properly maintain the canal, both of which can cause serious flooding issues for neighborhoods downstream.

District surveyors were recently on-site to stake the canal right-of-way, delineate property lines and identify any vegetative or structural encroachments. Due to the significant number of encroachments on the L-5 Canal, staff were unable to access the entire right-of-way and complete all field-staking for this project. Therefore, the District will be completing this project in multiple phases.

The first phase of canal rehabilitation is scheduled to begin in late April and will include removal of encroachments that are considered to pose the greatest threat to water flow in the canal channel. These high-risk encroachments include vegetation and other encroachments (structural and non-structural) that are located within the canal channel, on canal side slopes, and within a few feet of the top of canal bank, as well as any soil or rock deposits that have built-up in the canal channel. This first phase of canal rehabilitation may also include removal of encroachments which are easily accessible and within the District's canal right-of-way.

All encroachments and personal property within the District's canal-right-of way must be removed by the property owner. Please be advised that any encroachments remaining in the right-of-way at the commencement of this rehabilitation project may be removed and disposed of by the District.

Upon completion of this initial canal rehabilitation phase, the District will initiate subsequent staking and identification of the entire canal right-of-way and remove any remaining encroachments.
