Weather Update

Your are receiving this email because you have expressed an interest or are the designated flood control/drainage entity.

The District is closely monitoring the track of Hurricane Matthew.

As of 2pm today, the National Hurricane Center has pushed the storm slightly to the west, skimming Palm Beach County through Jacksonville. Chance of tropical storm force winds for some coastal areas of Palm Beach County is between 30 and 40 percent. Residents should monitor local news stations for tracking updates.

At this time, no neighborhood discharge control structures within the boundaries of LWDD should be opened. Property Managers/Residential Associations should take time now to ensure community control structures, swales, drains and outfall pipes are in working order and have an unobstructed flow. As needed, additional updates will be sent via email, Twitter and Facebook.

Caution should always be applied when walking or driving through flooded areas. For life threatening emergencies dial 911. Visit our website at www.lwdd.net for more information on managing water.
