Weather Update

Residential Communities within the boundaries of LWDD may open their neighborhood discharge control structures today, October 5, 2016 from 9AM to 5PM. All discharge control structures must be closed by 5PM today.

Residents are reminded that District canal levels may increase with rainfall but will slowly recede in response to primary control structures making the necessary discharges. Rainfall may raise community lake levels and produce temporary flooding of streets, sidewalks and yards in low lying areas. Remember that these areas are designed and constructed to hold and store excess rainfall runoff to avoid flooding of homes and businesses
