



## Weather Update 2 for Sep. 6, 2017

You are receiving this email because you have expressed an interest or are the designated flood control/drainage entity for your community or business.

---

The District is closely monitoring Hurricane Irma and releasing water from its canal system in coordination with the South Florida Water Management District. Crews are in the field today assessing the canal system and performing maintenance.

**Residential communities with operable internal discharge control structures may open tomorrow, Thursday (9/7/2017) at 8am and remain open, throughout the night, until Friday (9/8/2017) at 5pm.**

While structures are open, communities must ensure they have positive outflow (water is flowing toward the canal). Structures must be closed if the flow of water is toward the community's lake. Communities should also inspect their drainage swales and storm drains to ensure there are no obstructions that will block the flow of water away from their property.
